


SHOW WHAT YOU KNOW

When we process our learning by showing, retelling, and expressing, it reinforces our understanding. And, we just might inform and entertain an audience while we're at it!



Today's popular digital tools come in two flavors. Web apps frequently use Adobe Flash and do not function on iPad, and mobile apps are often made for a specific device. While you might not find the same tool as a web app and as a mobile app, you can usually find an equivalent.

Web

These tools work inside your web browser on Windows, Mac, and Linux.

Mobile

These tools work on Apple iPad. You might find versions for iPhone, iPod touch, and Android.



recordmp3.org

Click the button to start audio recording. When done, you can download the mp3 file or copy the recording URL for sharing.



tonyv.me/myna

Use Myna to combine voice recordings with music and sound effects. Trim, loop and stretch audio clips.

AUDIO RECORDINGS

Record summaries, skits, mock interviews, radio shows, news segments, reflections and perhaps add music and sound effects.



Croak.it

Tap the Record button to record up to 30 seconds. When done, your recording is automatically uploaded to Croak.it's website. You can copy and share the URL.



Audioboo

Record up to 3 minutes of audio. Optionally choose an image and share the audio online. Recordings are given a URL at audioboo.fm.



ipiccy.com

Combine multiple images using a variety of frames. Add text, stickers, and shapes. Registration is not required.



edu.glogster.com

Mash up photos, videos, music and clip art to make and publish digital posters.

COLLAGES

Construct meaning through visual images. Make art, posters, diagrams, flyers, charts, advertisements, and illustrations.



Pic Collage

Import images and arrange them on a canvas. Choose any image as the background and add text boxes.



Album FX Lite

Piece together a multiple-page scrapbook using backgrounds, images, text, animations, and clip art.



makebeliefscomix.com

Create your own comic strip using a diverse cast of characters and a variety of objects and scenes.



pixton.com

Add your own images or use Pixton's character generator and clip art to make and share comic strips.

COMICS

Putting speech bubbles and captions on top of illustrations can tell a story, represent knowledge, and showcase creativity.



Comic Touch Lite

Import a single image and add speech balloons and captions.



Strip Designer

Make comic strips and comic books by importing images and adding balloons, stickers, and text. Save as a PDF or as a series of images. \$2.99



simplebooklet.com

Create page flip brochures, flyers, and product guides you can email, post, and share across the web and mobile devices.



zooburst.com

Create your own pop-up books. Your books can be about any subject because you can import your own images.

ELECTRONIC BOOKS

Make fiction and nonfiction books for others to read.



StoryKit

Make a book that can be published on a webpage. Each page can have images, drawings, sounds, and text.



ScribblePress

Use drawing and text tools to make ePub formatted books. Books can be exported to your iBooks app or published online.



present.me

Import a PowerPoint, PDF, or other file. Present into your webcam while clicking through your slides.



sliderocket.com

Import a series of images, PowerPoint, or Google Presentation and add audio.

NARRATED SLIDESHOWS

Merge images and audio to give commentary to pictures.



VoiceThread

Talk, type, and draw on documents, snapshots, and videos. Requires a VoiceThread account.



SonicPics

Queue up a series of images and press record. Click the screen to change images while you are recording. \$2.99



wevideo.com

Upload media and piece it together collaboratively. Works like iMovie and MovieMaker, but it's all done in your web browser.



youtube.com/editor

Splice together your YouTube videos and Creative Commons videos. Add text, effects, music, and transitions.

MOVIES

Edit video to make news stories, reenactments, demonstrations, tutorials, skits, interviews, or educational films.



Splice

Combine photos and videos from your Photo Library and sounds from your Music app and add transitions, titles, and effects.



Videolicious

Make a documentary-style film with a video introduction and cuts to other videos and photos. There's a 50 second time limit.



goanimate.com

Use drag and drop tools to add characters, objects, scenes, actions, music, and voice recordings.



kerpoof.com

Make an animated movie by selecting scenes, characters, actions, and text.

ANIMATIONS

Make educational and entertaining videos featuring animated characters and objects.



PuppetPals HD

Pick out your actors, objects, and backgrounds, drag them on stage, and tap record. Your movements and audio are recorded for playback and saving.




Mad Lips

Transform a picture into a talking animation by superimposing a video of your mouth saying something onto the picture.



educreations.com

Create a screencast using Education's recordable whiteboard.




screenr.com

Click the record button, capture your screen and voice, and share the link. Recordings are limited to 5 minutes.

SCREENCASTS

Record your voice and everything that happens on your screen and to make demonstrations and to tell stories.



ShowMe

Drop images from your Photo Library onto the canvas. Tap record and draw on the whiteboard. The project uploads to showme.com.



Explain Everything

Annotate, animate, and narrate over images and drawings. Projects can be saved to a variety of services and your Photo Library. \$2.99


